

## Safeguarding and Protection of Adults at Risk

### BACKGROUND:

Many adults rely on other people to help them in their day to day living. This may be due to illness, disability or frailty. They may be at risk from people they know such as a relative, friend, neighbour or paid carer, or less frequently, by a stranger.

### COURSE AIM:

This course aims to enable all staff to implement the principles of safeguarding and protection in housing, health & social care.

### LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. Be able to recognise and respond appropriately to a potential adult at risk and concerns.
2. Be aware of the types of abuse and possible signs and symptoms and their impact.
3. Have an understanding of their roles and responsibilities with regard to safeguarding adults at risk.
4. Have an awareness of legislation, policies, procedures and guidance relating to the protection of adults at risk.
5. Know how to report a concern or allegation of abuse.
6. To be aware of the importance of effective multi-agency practice.

### ORGANISATIONAL BENEFITS:

Making sure your organisation has policies and procedures in place for safeguarding vulnerable adults from harm and abuse, enabling staff and volunteers to know what to do if they have concerns or receive a disclosure.

Support staff will be equipped to manage the often difficult and stressful situations that are presented whilst safeguarding vulnerable adults.
