

Safeguarding Children and Child Protection (Level 2)

BACKGROUND:

In order to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people, all those working with children must have knowledge and skills to carry out their own roles. Furthermore, everyone who works with children has a responsibility to ensure their welfare and safety.

COURSE AIM:

Enhance awareness of the need to protect children, and to support staff in their role by giving them knowledge of relevant policy and procedure with regard to safeguarding.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of this course staff will have enhanced skills and knowledge and feel more confident in the following areas:

1. Be aware of the definitions and types of abuse and their impact on children and young people.
2. Be able to recognise and appropriately respond to safeguarding and child protection concerns.
3. Have an understanding of child protection process and how key agencies work together to identify and meet the needs of children where there are safeguarding concerns.
4. Have an awareness of legislation, policies, procedures and guidance relating to safeguarding children (including statutory requirements governing consent, confidentiality and information sharing)
5. Have examined attitudes and values, which may affect the practice of safeguarding and promoting children and young people's welfare.

ORGANISATIONAL BENEFITS:

Making sure your organisation has policies and procedures in place for safeguarding children and young people from harm and abuse, enabling staff and volunteers to know what to do if they have concerns.

Support staff will be equipped to manage the often difficult and stressful situations that are presented whilst safeguarding children and young people.
